


Cup Style Fabric Mask



Fabric Requirements (per mask):

(2) pieces of batik 13" x 7 ¼"

1" x 40" knit t-shirt fabric (the bottom of a large t-shirt is a great size!). Pull on the fabric to make it "curl". This will create a cord.



Instructions:

Cut out template on the dashed line.

Fold fabric in half to make a square that measures 6½" x 7¼"

Place template on top of the fabric - make sure you place the template correctly on the fold.

Cut out both pieces of batik.

Fold single fabric piece in half width wise, RS together. Mark ¼" from the fold along the top edge. Make another mark on the fold 1" from top. Draw a line from the top mark to the bottom mark for the dart. Keeping the mask folded in half, sew dart following your markings, making sure to back stitch on both ends. Sew the bottom dart following photo A. Press darts to one side. Repeat with other mask piece.

Unfold & layer the two fabric pieces right sides together.

Starting at one side edge of end tab, stitch ¼" around entire mask, ending at the opposite side edge of beginning tab. Turn the mask right side out through opening.

Press around all edges, folding under ¼" on open end. Pin shut. Edge stitch around entire mask.

Fold over the side tabs ½" to WS. Edge stitch along sewn edge, creating a casing for the ties. (Photo B)

String the cord through the casings on the sides with a large needle or safety pin. (Photo C)

NOTE: On some of the ones I made, I had the cord inside the casing as I stitched it. You just need to be careful not to stitch your cord!
